CH-45 Making Honey



Plants produce a sweet liquid in the flowers called nectar . This is collected by bees



Most flower bloom in the spring. During this time honey bees collect the nectar. They use their long tongues to suck the nectar out of the flowers. Then they store it in their stomachs. The nectar becomes honey inside the bee's stomach



The bees build a group of small cells of wax in their hive. This group of cells is called a honeycomb . Bees drop their honey in the comb till the comb becomes



Beekeepers take out honey by cutting off wax caps from each comb .Usually it is yellow or golden brown in colour.



The wax has to be treated well before use. After taking it out from the hive , the honey is stored in wooden boxes. In late summer these frames are filled with honey and then it is ready to be eaten by all.

The blue Whale is the largest and heaviest animal in the world .Even the largest of the dinosaurs was lighter than the blue whale! Blue whale live in groups, A 2002 report says that are only 5,000 -12,000 blue whales left in total.



The green turtle is one of the largest sea turtles . It is named after the greenish colour of its skin and not its shell .An adult turtle can weigh upto 300 kilos! The number of green turtles in the seas has reduced greatly.



The giant panda , also known as the panda bear , is a bear living in the bamboo forests of China . It is an adorable and peaceful animal with black and white coat .It is said that only about 1,800 of them are alive.



The Bengal tiger is the national animal of both India and Bangladesh . It has a yellow to light orange coat with black stripes . With a white underbelly , a long tail, huge paws and fearsome strong teeth, the Bengal tiger is a majestic beast. Fewer than 2,500 Bengal tigers are left in the world.
