CBSE Class X exams: Results bring cheer

Ahmedabad: The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) announced the Class X board exam results on Friday.

The number of students scoring more than 95% has increased. Most city schools registered 100% results and a large number of students secured distinction marks.

The Class X students of Delhi Public School, Bopal, cruised through the board exams with a 100% result. Of the 451 students who took the exams, 57 scored above 95% and 147 scored above 90%.

The school topper Priyanshu Nayak scored 99.60%. He was followed by Khushi Bansal with 99.40%. As many as 25 students scored the perfect 100 in various subjects.

At DPS Gandhinagar, of the 287 students who took the exams, 80 secured above 90%. Aniket Kaushesh, Sreshtha Lahiri, and Kushagra Maheshwari emerged as the toppers with 99%. The second position was secured by Ashvi Patel and The result is beyond my expectation and I am on the top of the world as my hard work has paid off. I never studied for more than four hours a day, but I was regular in my studies right from the beginning of the year. I studied NCERT textbooks thoroughly and solved all CBSE sample papers

In all, 173 students of St Kabir School took the boards and 80 scored 90% and above. Scoring 97.6%, Manushree Rawat emerged as the school topper. Raina Patel secured the second position with 97.4%. As many as 119 students of Maharaja

Agrasen Vidyalaya took the exams. Of them, 87 students scored above 75%. Tejanshi Jani secured the first position with 98%. Kavya Kapadia and Urja Sheth secured the second position with 97.8%.

At Divine Child International School, Hrishika Rana emerged as the school topper with 97%. She was followed by Tushar Sukhwani with 96.8%.

Of the 184 students of Zebar School for Children who took the exams, 49 scored above 90%. Bhoomi Khandelwal emerged as the school topper with 98.6% and she was followed by Dhruv Makhija with 97.4%.

Of the 314 students from Udgam School for Children who took the exams, 132 scored above 90%. Yashvi Modi emerged as the school topper with 99%. She was followed by Diya Patel with 98.8% and Deergh Patel with 98.2%.

Of the 132 students who took the exams from Prakash School, 114 got distinction marks. Ananya Shah emerged as the school topper with 98.2%. She was followed by Dhruvaj Shah with 97.4%.

Rachana School registered 100% results. Of the total 102 students who took the exams, 30 scored above 90%. Mayank Pandya was the school topper with 98.4%. He was followed by Divyaraj Singh Gaur with 96.6%.
