The students of Class VII of Delhi Public School Gandhinagar had an enriching educational trip to Dinosaur Fossil Park, Balasinor on 14 October 2025. The visit to the dinosaur park aimed to provide students with an immersive experience into the prehistoric past, exploring the geological and paleontological history of the region and fostering a connection with the natural world.

The visit began at the modern Dinosaur Museum, which featured ten galleries showcasing India's and Gujarat's paleontological history. Students explored interactive displays and observed multimedia exhibits detailing dinosaur eras, evolution, extinction theories, and India-specific species like the Rajasaurus Narmadensis. They were then thrilled by a special 3D and 5D film and a virtual reality experience that brought the prehistoric world to life.

After exploring the modern museum, the students proceeded to the actual fossil park in Raiyoli village, a 72-acre site once a nesting ground for dinosaurs. They witnessed real dinosaur eggs and bones still embedded in the ground, connecting the museum's displays to their real-world context. This hands-on, on-site experience provided a thrilling glimpse into the daily life of these prehistoric creatures from millions of years.

The highlight of the trip was the visit to the fossil park, where students could stand at one of the world's largest dinosaur hatcheries and witness real fossilized eggs and bone fragments still embedded in the rocks. They learned about the discovery of India's unique dinosaur, the Rajasaurus Narmadensis, and gained an awe-inspiring insight into the prehistoric world that once existed right where they were standing. For many, the chance to see a 65-million-year-old fossil was a truly unforgettable experience.
