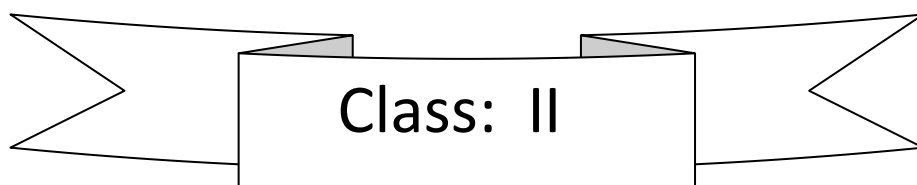

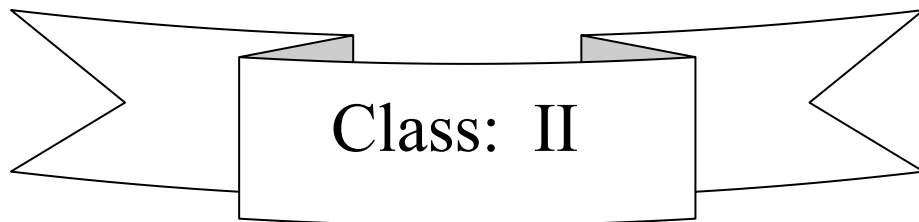

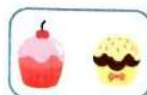

Solution:

Number of pencils in 1 box = 4 pencils

Number of pencils in 2 boxes = 2×4
= 8 pencils

By repeated addition:

$$4 + 4 = 8$$

By multiplication:

$$2 \times 4 = 8$$

Ans. 2 boxes will have 8 pencils.

2. If 1 bicycle has 3 tyres. How many tyres will 8 bicycles have?

Solution:

Number of tyres in 1 bicycle = 3 tyres

Number of tyres in 8 bicycles = 8×3
= 24 tyres

By repeated addition:

$$8 + 8 + 8 = 24$$

By multiplication:

$$8 \times 3 = 24$$

Ans. 8 bicycles will have 24 tyres.
