

Pyjama Party was celebrated on 27th April. Little toddlers dressed up in their colourful night suits walked in hugging their favorite soft toys. Concept of Day and Night was taught by taking children to different rooms. Teachers decorated the night room with owls, bats, moon, stars etc. which are seen during the night. Children passed through the play tunnel from day room to night room. They danced on peppy foot-tapping music and coloured the day away.





Posting The Shapes

Learning Disability

DPSG organized a Talk on "Learning Disability" for the teachers of classes I to V. The session was conduced by the school counsellor (Pre Primary and Primary Section).

The objective was to counsel as to how effectively a teacher can help students academically and emotionally, especially those, who face learning



disabilities. The counsellor briefed the parents on the issues of: Dyslexia, Dysgraphia and Dyscalculia their signs, symptoms and treatment.

International English Olympiad

6th SOF International English Olympiad was held on 20th January 2016. The result saw students from classes III to XII achieving ennoble ranks. Altogether, 13 Gold Medals of Excellence, 24 Gold, 10 Silver and 8 Bronze medals were secured by the students.







World No Tobacco Day – Essay Writing Competition

This WHO initiative was observed on 31st May. The students of DPS, Gandhinagar took the call with all sincerity. International Mathematics Olympiad 2015-16



1st level of 9th International Mathematics Olympiad organised by SOF was held in the month of December 2015. The result was announced on 2nd May 2016. 254 students from classes VI to XII appeared for the exam. 6 students received Gold Medal of Excellence. Altogther, there were 7 Gold, 7 Silver and 7 Bronze medals. 12 students from classes VI to XII qualified for 2nd level which was held in the month of February 2016. Three students were awarded with gifts worth Rs. 1000 and a merit certificate.
